Assignment criteria

To receive credit, students must complete all of the following:

- 1. Attend at least three presentations at the Social and Emotional Learning Conference and write a three-page reflection paper:
 - a. Papers should be typed and printed on 8.5 x 11-inch paper, double-spaced, with 1-inch margins on all sides; stapled together
 - b. Title page that includes the following:
 - i. Your name
 - ii. Instructor's name (Denise Tallakson)
 - iii. Course title
 - c. Do not exceed three pages.
- 2. Design three social and emotional learning-based lessons to be integrated into your curriculum. Follow the below format for lesson design:
 - Title (name of unit)
 - Grade level
 - Objectives (numbered and written)
 - Standards-Common Core
 - Materials (listed)
 - Lesson procedures (outlined in this order): Introduction Activity

- 3. Read a professional journal article and summarize how you will incorporate the main ideas into your curriculum.
 - a. Write a two-page summary, typed and printed on 8.5 x 11-inch paper, double-spaced, with 1-inch margins on all sides; stapled together
 - b. Article dated between 2016 and 2022
 - c. Article chosen from a professional journal based on social and emotional learning

The aggregation of preparation, time on tasks, assignments, and interaction must reflect rigor and expectations equivalent to the federal definition of the credit hour – 15 hours of direct faculty instruction and a minimum of 30 hours of out-of-class student work for each credit hour awarded.
